Introduction

The Northwest Territories Floatplane Association (NWTFA) was formed in 2004 by local aviation enthusiasts who envisioned an organization which would support general aviation and air safety, showcase the rich aviation history of the Northwest Territories, and promote the region as an "aviation friendly" destination. NWTFA has become a prominent voice for private pilots, aircraft owners and supporters of general aviation and regularly engages in consultation and advocacy on matters impacting general aviation in the Northwest Territories.

NWTFA is affiliated with Canadian Owners and Pilots Association which permits access to quality programs and provides the NWT's general aviation community with a common voice relating to matters of mutual interest discussed at a national level.
